Better Together | Our Plans for 2021

On Sunday we laid out our plans for 2021 at Headwaters. We thought it would be good to give you a summary review in writing so you are up to date and informed as to what is coming:

Wednesday Nights

On Wednesday February 3rd we are planning to resume in person AWANA, Steps Discipleship Classes, as well as Youth Group. Each of these activities will be offered in a "masks required" and "masks optional" environment. Plus, our Wednesday night ministries will be held at Wells Street for the very first time!

Offices Relocate

We are planning to move our weekday administrative functions to Wells Street by the end of February. We are currently renovating Building 2 at Wells Street and hope to have it usable for our staff offices by that time.

1 Church, 1 Location

We are moving forward with the plan to permanently unite our Church Family on Sundays at one campus on April 11th. The need for this has become more apparent the longer we have been at two campuses. Maintaining two ministry sites has stretched our resources to the limit. We do not have the staff (either paid or volunteer) to keep up this pace. The cost of maintaining the Wallen Road site is not that great, but the cost of us being separated any longer is. This is what we have been planning for the last two years. Even though it may not be the circumstances we envisioned, it will allow us to pursue the vision we have had for our church since the purchase of the Wells Street

site. When we get to April we will hold either four socially distanced services, or we will have two services not socially distanced, depending on how things are going in our county with the virus at that time. Since we have completed renovations on the Chapel, we have the ability to hold simultaneous services in different parts of the building.

As you reflect on these announcements, we hope that you sense the excitement of the possibilities that God has put before us. 2021 looks to be perhaps the most fruitful ministry year in the history of our church. We are in conversation with a variety of potential partnerships that would fill our new home [Wells Street campus] with activity for the sake of the Gospel. Hopefully God will open the doors to several of these before the year's end, so that we can begin to enjoy serving our city in new and dynamic ways. In all these plans our trust is in Him to walk before us and with us. Let us join together in this exciting journey!



Ministry Spotlight

It's Time to Nominate Deacons

Appointments

The word deacon comes from the Greek word *diakonos* which refers to being a servant.

Deacons are nominated by the church membership each year. Nominees are affirmed by the Elders after proper vetting per biblical qualifications.

All prospective Deacons are subjected to "Yes or No" vote by the membership. (Simple majority vote needed).

Terms are 3 years. Men may be re-nominated for successive terms. The number of Deacons is driven by the size of the congregation.

Responsibilities

To function as a council of biblically-qualified men to attend to the physical needs of the local body.

"Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

- James 1: 27

Qualifications

1 Timothy 3:8-13 "Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. And let them also be tested first then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. Their wives likewise must be dianified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus."

Their Goal

To minister and serve the body of Christ. Deacons serve orphans, widows, and any other families in need with a focus on Headwaters families.

Deacon Wives

The wives of deacons also have directions from Timothy:

"Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things." Married Deacons serve with their wife and she should also understand the expectations.

At Headwaters, what do Deacons do?

- Meet monthly on Sunday evenings
- Communion Prep* | Team of two.
 Once a month
- Serve Communion
- Deacon of the Day* (DOD) | Teams of two at each location. Sunday morning rotation.
- Count Offering* | Teams of two.
 Once a month
- Food Pantry* | Serving families on Sundays or Wednesday nights
- Baptism Prep | Assist those being baptized.
- Caring in Action (CIA) |
 Distributing benevolence funds to Headwaters families in need.
- Annual Church Picnic | Planning, setup, and cleanup
- Thanksgiving Dinner | Setup and teardown.
- Widows | Meet various needs
- Projects | Various project to help Headwaters families




HomeGroups Join STEPS




Tuesday Morning Study for Women




